
Design competition

- Goal: Reduce pedestrian & bike congestion on bridge promenade;
- 200+ entries;
- 3 chosen for further development;
- Added goal: Covid-19 response;
- Expert jury and stakeholder input during design review meetings.





Transport





- Replace Brooklyn-bound lanes with open space, walkway & cycle expressway;
- Shift vehicle traffic to Manhattan-bound lanes (1 lane/direction + break-down lane);
- Reconfigure vehicle access & create new walking/cycling access routes.


Open Space






- Provide walkway & cycle expressway to relieve promenade congestion;
- Create and animate new open space for activities, hanging-out & social distancing;
- Develop a virtual bridge app supporting engagement, education & entertainment.


Public Engagement





- Develop near-term design with limited (due to Covid) stakeholder / expert input;
- Use extensive in-person and virtual engagement program to revise design;
- Experiment with traffic changes and open space design + activities.





Timing





- San Francisco took advantage of an earthquake to remove the Embarcadero Freeway;
- Stockholm took advantage of a political situation to test congestion charging;
- New York took advantage of their experience to pedestrianize Times Square.

Conclusions

Urban transport needs major change.

Experimentation can inspire change.

Look for opportunities to experiment.
